Full Course Description: This course deals with the history of the development of the study of international relations, the main theories and schools of thought in this field, and the importance of political and economic issues in the nature of relations between actors in international relations

Full Course Description: This course examines the basic concepts of political theory such as the concept of the state as well as the study of political phenomena. It also deals with the study of political theoretical values such as the values of justice, freedom, equality, etc., as well as the study of the evolution of political thought and its relation to the environment in which it originated either by analyzing the evolution of political ideas or by studying the contributions of senior philosophers of politics in antiquity, middle, modern, and contemporary, including the study of liberal, national, and other thought. The course also discusses the approaches of the study of political theory and political thought.

Full Course Description: This course deals with the field of comparative political science and its evolution, the methodological assets in the study of political systems, the methods used in the study of old and modern political systems, the environmental framework of the political system in its internal and external aspects, the functions of the governmental and non-governmental political systems, and the performance of the political system in light of public policy. It also discusses how to prepare and evaluate these policies and their impact on society, and focuses on some of the functions of inputs in the political system, such as the functions of participation and political socialization.

Course ID: 1714011213 **Description:** International Economic Relations

Full Course Description: This course offers an exploration of the international economic relations in their three aspects: monetary, financial, and commercial, and how such interaction among those aspects affects the states' behavior. The course also examines the most important international economic agreements and the most important federal experiences such as the European Union (EU), Asian countries, and North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). The course also examines the process of economic overlap with local economies by discussing the importance of the role of the International Monetary Fund (IMF), the World Bank (WB), and the World Trade Organization (WTO) in economic relations among countries

Course ID: 1714011214 **Description:** International Law

Full Course Description: This course deals with the definition of International Public Law, its characteristics, resources, and persons, with the definition of the international law system and its relation to national legal systems. The course also aims to study the state within the framework of the international law system with the consequent issues such as international borders, recognition of states and governments, international responsibility, and international balance.

Full Course Description: This course deals with the definition of international organizations in terms of their origin, development, classification, legal personality, apparatuses, membership conditions and financing. The course also teaches examples of the most important international organizations according to their different classifications.

Full Course Description: This course introduces the students to the use of scientific, methodological and statistical skills in designing and implementing scientific research papers. This includes the stages of writing up a scientific research, practical applications of the scientific research principals, and the application of quantitative methods and statistical tests using specialized statistical software such as SPSS.

Full Course Description: This course introduces students to the definition of political terms, concepts, issues, political phenomena, and definitions related to international relations, strategy, foreign policy, and regional studies in English

The course also anatomizes the answers offered by Muslim thinkers to the challenges facing Islamic societies today and how to deal strategically with them. Finally, the course discusses the most important principles of the Amman Message.
